The Regional Conservation Partnership Program is a new program that mobilizes partnerships to multiply investments and reach common conservation goals.

- RCPP promotes coordination between NRCS and its partners to deliver conservation assistance to producers and landowners.
- NRCS provides assistance to producers through partnership agreements and through program contracts or easement agreements.
- Through RCPP, NRCS and its partners help producers install and maintain conservation activities in selected project areas.
- Partners leverage RCPP funding in project areas and report on the benefits achieved.





Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP)

RCPP funds are delivered in accordance with:

- EQIP the Environmental Quality Incentives Program
- CSP the Conservation Stewardship Program
- ACEP the Agricultural Conservation Easement Program
- HFRP Healthy Forest Reserve Program

The current 5 year
Farm Bill authorizes a total of
\$1.2 Billion to be available through RCPP





Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP)

Eligible Partners:

- Agricultural producer associations
- Farmer cooperatives
- State, local, and Tribal governments,
- Water Districts
- Conservation-driven nonprofits
- Universities

Eligible Participants - Under

RCPP, eligible producers and landowners of agricultural land and non-industrial private forestland may enter into conservation program contracts or easement agreements under the framework of a partnership agreement.

National RCPP

- Applications that address multi-state resource concerns, and those that provide detail on how specific resource objectives will be monitored to assess outcomes, will be given priority under the national funding pool.
- National priorities established under this announcement for program funding include:
 - Water quantity;
 - Water quality;
 - Soil health;
 - At-risk species habitat; and
 - Air quality.







Critical Conservation Areas

Critical Conservation Areas (CCAs) are designated by the Secretary of Agriculture and are an opportunity for many stakeholders to work together at a regional level to address common natural resource goals while maintaining agricultural productivity.

Columbia River CCA


Goal: To promote water quality and management of water quantity to benefit recovery of salmon populations.

Resource Concern Priorities

Insufficient Water: Inefficient use of irrigation water

Water Quality Degradation: Excessive sediment in surface waters; excess nutrients and pesticides in surface and ground waters

Inadequate Habitat for Fish and Wildlife: Habitat degradation







Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP)

State RCPP

Project applications submitted for consideration through the state funding pool should address at least one of the national priorities or a state-identified priority, as identified by NRCS State Conservationist, with input from the State Technical Committees and Tribal Conservation Advisory Councils.

State Resource Concerns

Idaho: Forestland Health, Rangeland Health, Soil Health\Soil Erosion, Species of Concern Wetland\Upland, Water Quality, Water Quantity

Washington: Air Quality, Degraded Plant Condition, Inadequate Habitat for Fish and Wildlife, Soil Degradation, Water Quality Degradation

Oregon: Forest Health and Biodiversity: addressing pest pressures to promote a more resilient forest stand against fire, Water Quality: sedimentation, nutrients and temperature affecting aquatic species, Water Quantity: regarding irrigation efficiency and management, Wildlife Habitat Degradation: affecting strategic habitats in Oregon






Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP)

2014 RCPP

- Nationally, USDA received more than 600 RCPP pre-proposals in the first year of the program.
- The Department funded 115 of those projects, totaling more than \$370 million.
- Additionally, partners have contributed an estimated \$400 million, more than doubling USDA's investment.
