What is EPR?

- Primary responsibility on producers
- Law and agency set standards
- Producers have flexibility to develop and implement services

Prevents abuse, addiction and accidental poisoning




Other health and environmental impacts




Legislative history and intent

- House Bill 3273 (2019)
- Convenient statewide service
- Operational by July 1, 2021

What drugs are covered?

Drugs covered:

- Prescription drugs
- Over-the-Counter (OTC) drugs
- Brand name drugs
- Generic drugs

Drugs not covered (examples):

- Supplements
- Homeopathic drugs
- Exposed sharps
- Drugs used for animal medicines
- Biologics



Program operator responsibilities

Collection Services:

- Mail-back
- Drop-off sites
 - Per county, additional per population center
 - Reasonably convenient and equitable access
 - If can't establish, offer services and events
- No charge to covered entities




Program operator responsibilities

Public awareness:

- Website and toll-free number
- Written materials
- Goal to foster full public awareness
- Biennial survey



Timeline for Implementation



Rulemaking

Adopted by EQC in Sept.

- Ensure effective oversight
- Set fees
- Ensure access for minority, low-income, rural and other historically underserved communities

Committing to Equity

Rulemaking:

- "Convenient and equitable access" includes access for historically underserved communities
- Set goal for fostering awareness in underserved communities
- For additional services/events, show engagement with underserved communities



Committing to Equity

Implementation:

- Ongoing process for DEQ and program operators
- Engaging local public health officials
- Identifying community groups and partners



Current status

- Two plans received
- DEQ will post plans and invite input
- Issue decision by end of Jan. 2021
- Additional rounds of review possible
