General Findings

Winter inspection forms (documenting the inaccessibility of the site) were completed for the month of January, February, March and December, during which time precipitation fell in the form of snow. Inspections associated with rain events (an internal trigger) occurred during the months of May and September. The remaining six months of the year had the regular routine monthly inspections. The monthly routine and rain event-related inspections all followed the guidelines specified in Sections 3.1 and 3.1.2 of the permit. Observations during inspections indicated structural and non-structural controls were implemented and maintained in accordance with the site SWPPP.

Pursuant to Section 3.2.3 of the MSGP, which provides for alternative assessment schedules in climates with irregular runoff. During 2019, quarterly visual assessments were conducted at Outfall 2 on April 1st, May 1st, September 5th, and November 10th; none of the characteristics listed in Section 3.2.1 of the MSGP (i.e., color, odor, clarity, floating solids, settled and suspended solids, foam, sheen, or other indicators of pollution) were observed.
