Enclosed is the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's Report to Congress on the EPA's Alternative Toxicity Testing activities as requested in the House of Representatives Department of the Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies Appropriations Bill, 2018 (House Report 115-238).

The EPA is providing this report to address the following areas:

- 1. Progress to date to research, develop, validate, and translate innovative, non-animal chemical testing methods that characterize toxicity pathways;

- 3. Future plans to continue to implement the toxicity testing vision outlined in the January 2017 National Academies of Science report, "Using 21st Century Science to Improve Risk-Related Evaluations" on all agency programs that involve toxicity testing.
