

Have Legal Questions? Here is a list of some local resources that you may contact for more information about your rights and options. There may be other legal resources that can help you as well. - **Northwest Justice Project.** To learn whether you qualify for free assistance from Northwest Justice Project, and:
 - (1) You are age 60 and over (regardless of income or county), call CLEAR*Sr at 1-888-387-7111 weekdays from 9:15 a.m. until 12:15 p.m.; *OR*
 - (2) You are low-income and have a civil legal problem outside King County, call CLEAR at 1-888-201-1014 weekdays from 9:15 a.m. until 12:15 p.m.; *OR*
 - (3) You are a migrant farm worker, or do not have access to a telephone, call the Yakima NJP office directly at 1-888-201-1018.

- **Northwest Immigrant Rights Project.** The NWIRP provides assistance in immigration matters to low-income individuals and families. To learn whether you qualify for assistance from the NWIRP, and:
 - (1) You live in Western Washington, call 206.587.4009 or toll free at 800.445.5771; *OR*
 - (2) You live in Eastern or Central Washington, call 509.854.2100 or toll free at 888.756.3641.

- **Latina/o Bar Association of Washington Legal Clinic.** The LBAW is a walk-in legal clinic in Seattle open on the 2nd Wednesday of each month from 6:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. The clinic is held at El Centro de la Raza, 2524 16th Ave. South, Seattle, WA.
